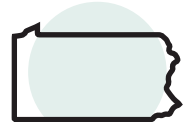


Leslie Slingsby Appointed to Pennsylvania Opioid Abuse Child Impact Task Force

CEO of Services and Operations, Leslie Slingsby, was appointed to Pennsylvania's Opioid Abuse Child Impact Task Force by former Governor Tom Wolf in April of 2022. The task force focuses on improving the safety, well-being and permanency of substance-exposed children and infants who have been affected by their parents' substance abuse disorders. Pennsylvania is one of the states hit hardest America's opioid epidemic. In her role, Leslie took critical steps to subvert its devastating impact on children.

Expanding Our Reach & Services

Satellite Location Opens in Pottstown, PA

In May of 2022, Mission Kids opened its doors to our first-ever satellite location in Pottstown, PA. We are so proud that children and families in the Western part of Montgomery County no longer have to travel such a long distance for the necessary services to achieve healing and justice after experiencing physical and sexual abuse. We're thrilled to share that we were awarded "Satellite Membership" accreditation status by the National Children's Alliance following an extensive application and review process for our Pottstown office. The launch of this new facility has enabled us to bring essential services directly to Montgomery County's most economically challenged community. The satellite location offers the same evidence-based, child-centered services that Mission Kids' flagship location currently provides in East Norriton, Pennsylvania.



Enhancing Forensic Interview Capabilities with Mobile Equipment Grant

Mission Kids has been awarded a significant grant to acquire new mobile forensic interview equipment, including Signalscape's StarWitness Field Interviewer, addressing the urgent need for off-site forensic interviews and ensuring high-quality services for children facing barriers to accessing the Child Advocacy Center (CAC). This grant supports Mission Kids' commitment to meeting National Children's Alliance accreditation standards, delivering top-quality services to vulnerable clients, and strengthening collaboration with Pennsylvania's Southeast Regional Department of Human Services. Additionally, the new equipment promotes the wider adoption of the CAC response model by law enforcement, improving both the quality and quantity of responses, and significantly bolstering Mission Kids' ability to fulfill its mission and support children in need.

Grants and Projects

Promoting Safe Behaviors: A Collaborative Partnership Funded by the Department of Justice

Generously awarded through the Department of Justice, Mission Kids received \$425,000 to be spent over three years to fund a collaborative partnership with Creative Health Services that provides evidence-based treatment for Youth with Problematic Sexual Behavior (YPSB). The Promoting Safe Behaviors (PSB) Program follows the Sexual Behavior-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (PSB-CBT) model – a family-oriented, cognitive behavioral, psychoeducational, and supportive treatment. PSB-CBT is designed to reduce or eliminate incidents of problematic sexual behavior. It involves caregiver participation and is provided as an open group, with most youth able to complete treatment successfully in six months. To ensure the program’s success, Mission Kids and Creative Health Services hired Kelly Hagenbaugh as the Program Clinical Supervisor. Ms. Hagenbaugh is a licensed social worker with over 15 years’ experience in the field of trauma treatment. She currently works with the University of Oklahoma as a member of their clinical training team providing clinical training, consultation and support to Youth with Problematic Sexual Behavior program sites across the country.

Project Safe and Smart

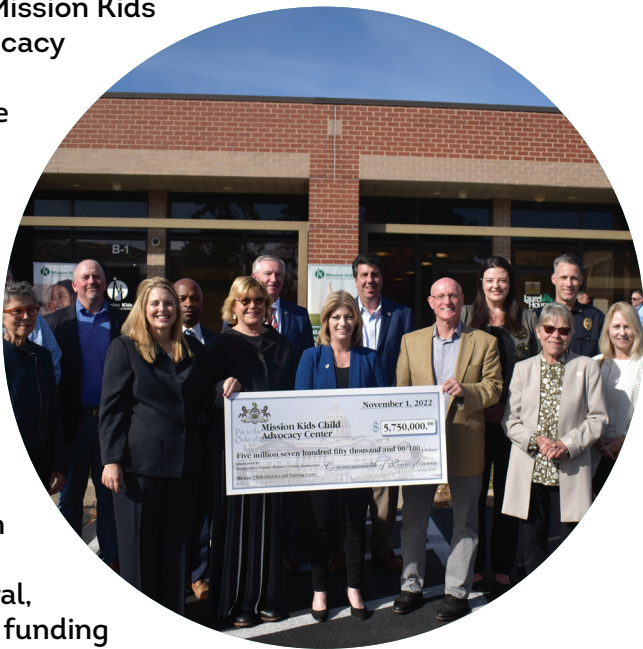
Mission Kids was awarded nearly \$370,000 in grant funding from the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) to provide prevention education to 10,000 second-grade students across Montgomery County over two years. As part of the grant, Mission Kids’ Prevention Education Department participated in a pilot program with Penn State University’s Child Maltreatment Solutions Network and PCCD for “Project Safe and Smart.” The program, called “Safe Touches,” is an evidence-based child sexual abuse prevention education workshop for children in second grade. To support this program, Mission Kids hired two additional, full-time Community Prevention Educators. These trained facilitators use puppets to provide children with evidence-based and developmentally-appropriate content about body safety while explaining what they can do if they, or someone they know, ever feel unsafe. The program was launched in September of 2022.



\$7.75 Million Secured in State Grants to Pursue New Building Project

Thanks to the unwavering support of our stakeholders and legislators in Montgomery County, as well as across the Commonwealth, Mission Kids can finally build a state-of-the-art, fully-equipped child advocacy center and regional training center. The CAC will include on-site medical services, trauma therapy suite, and collaborative space for law enforcement, child protection workers, and prosecution. The collaborative, multifaceted training facility will train professionals who respond to child abuse across the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic regions of the United States.

As part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021, Mission Kids secured \$2 million in funding to support our initiatives. ARPA, also known as the COVID-19 Stimulus Package, was enacted to accelerate recovery from the pandemic’s economic and health impacts. Later in the year, we were thrilled to secure an additional \$5.75 million through the Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP), a Commonwealth grant program for regional economic, cultural, civic, recreational, and historical improvement projects. This funding is transformational for the child abuse victims we serve and the child protection field within Pennsylvania.



Enhancing Accessibility: Translating Preventative and Responsive Materials

Thanks to the support of the VNA Foundation of Greater North Penn, Mission Kids translated child abuse prevention materials and supplementary informational materials into the languages most commonly spoken in Montgomery County. Due to the sensitive nature of child abuse services—both preventive and responsive—it is essential that all children and families can use the language with which they are most comfortable. Mission Kids has translated materials for languages including Spanish, Chinese (Mandarin and Cantonese), Korean, Hindi, Arabic, and Braille. With the support of this partnership, Mission Kids employs a full-time, bilingual Spanish-speaking Forensic Interviewer and Family Advocate to assist children and families in their preferred language.

Professional Growth & Wellness

Advancing Equity: Commitment to Learning and Action through RELC Program

Last year, Mission Kids was selected to participate in the Racial Equity Learning Community (RELC) Program, aimed at advancing racial equity and justice in Bucks and Montgomery Counties, Pennsylvania. This 10-month commitment, from September 2021 to June 2022, involved organizational learning, community-building, and action to deepen our capacity for change. Representatives from Mission Kids received consulting and training services from the nINACollective, which specializes in advancing racial equity within organizations. Upon completion, Mission Kids established the Diversity, Equity, and Access Plan (DEAP) Committee and outlined strategic goals for continued community outreach, ensuring ongoing growth and commitment to equity.



Cultivating Wellness: Nurturing Our Team Through Self-Care and Support

In alignment with our five-year strategic plan, Mission Kids dedicated 2022 to enhancing employee wellness. Recognizing the challenging nature of our work, we emphasized the importance of self-care and provided ample opportunities and resources for our staff. We rejuvenated our monthly staff meetings by holding them outdoors and offsite during the warmer months, creating a refreshing change of scenery. Throughout the summer, we embraced mindfulness with weekly sessions led by a master practitioner, guiding us in meditation and self-care practices. We also held wellness fairs and trainings for our multidisciplinary team partners to promote wellness across our entire multidisciplinary team. Additionally, a variety of wellness-focused activities were organized to empower our staff and cultivate a culture of self-care and well-being.



Looking FORWARD

Mission Kids is making significant strides in our journey. 2022 marked the second year of our Five-Year Strategic Plan, established by the invaluable contributions of nonprofit experts, community stakeholders, and our dedicated staff. This plan, which is guiding us as we expand the reach of our impact, has already shown promising results. The challenges we face at Mission Kids demand bold, visionary solutions, and we are on track to achieve our ultimate goals as evidenced throughout this year’s annual report. Our progress continues to be driven by the five strategic pillars established at the outset:



Excellence and expanded direct services

In the next five years, Mission Kids will open two new child protection facilities, including our new satellite office in Pottstown, and a state-of-the-art center that combines an expansion of all of services currently offered with on-site medical services.



Leadership

Working with national, state and local legislators to pass meaningful policy, Mission Kids will form new partnerships with leading academic researchers to improve victims’ experiences and advance international partnerships to help more victims of abuse.



Professional growth and wellness

Mission Kids’ staff deals with difficult, emotional material every day. To cope with this, significant resources will be devoted to advanced staff trainings while instituting extensive wellness practices and fostering diversity and equity in everything that Mission Kids does.



Sustainability for long-term success

Mission Kids will secure reliable funding and boost marketing initiatives that support its goals and increase awareness.



Data-driven outcomes

Mission kids will partner with researchers to better understand the needs of the children they serve, developing systems to monitor and track the success of its programs.
