Dear Friends of Mission Kids,

While I am pleased to introduce our 2019 Annual Report, which details impactful program developments and service outcomes, I am even more thankful for the tremendous dedication and commitment of our community to end child abuse. This past year has signified many advancements in the pursuit of healing and justice for child abuse victims.

One of these advancements is a partnership with Children’s Crisis Treatment Center in providing our first-ever educational support group for caregivers of children who have been sexually abused. Participants develop a clearer understanding of how trauma affects their child and learn tools to help them communicate with and support their child throughout the healing process. Due to its success, Mission Kids will continue to offer this service in our array of trauma-focused interventions.

Furthermore, Mission Kids strengthened its prevention education efforts through the introduction of the ROAR program. ROAR is a child-based education program that teaches children ages four through eight body safety and empowers them to raise their voices to speak out against abuse. Mission Kids has exceeded its initial goal of reaching over 2,800 children in Montgomery County in the last three months alone.

Lastly, we continue to focus on our forensic interviews, family advocacy services and trauma therapy so that our children can receive justice and support through the healing process in order to grow into healthy adults. Beyond helping individual children and their families, we’re utilizing our experience and expertise to influence public policy, research and practice on the state, national and international levels.

My sincere thanks to you, our donors, advocates and other supporters, for your unwavering commitment. Your support makes this work possible.

Mission Kids, a nationally-accredited Child Advocacy Center located in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, provides vital intervention services for children and their families that help them heal after child abuse has affected their lives.

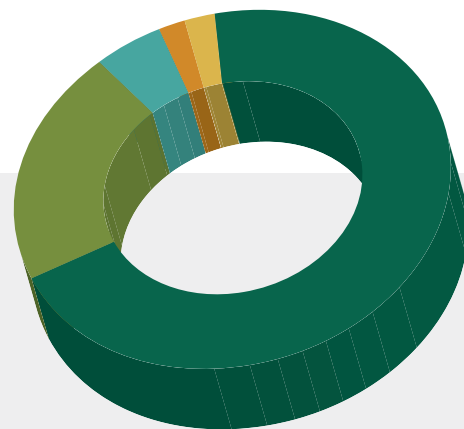
Who We Are

Mission Kids provides a center for the team investigation of child abuse cases. Forensic interviews are conducted in a manner that is legally sound, neutral, fact-finding and coordinated to avoid repeated interviews and trauma to the child. Representatives of the District Attorney's Office, law enforcement and social services work together as a multidisciplinary team to observe, but not participate in, the interview as it takes place, thereby reducing the number of interviews a child victim must undergo. This team approach supports and protects children throughout the legal process, preserving their physical and emotional well-being.

Mission Kids Family Advocates ensure that children and families get the support, education and resources they need to overcome the trauma of abuse for as long as they need assistance. Family Advocates play a crucial role in connecting clients with resources in the community to address various needs including domestic violence, housing, clothing, food and caregivers' mental health and medical needs.

579 Forensic Interviews

Mission Kids served 579 children and their families in 2019.

142 Mental Health Referrals

Family Advocates made 142 referrals to trauma therapists for children following their Mission Kids Forensic Interview to ensure they received specialized mental health intervention.

87 Medical Referrals

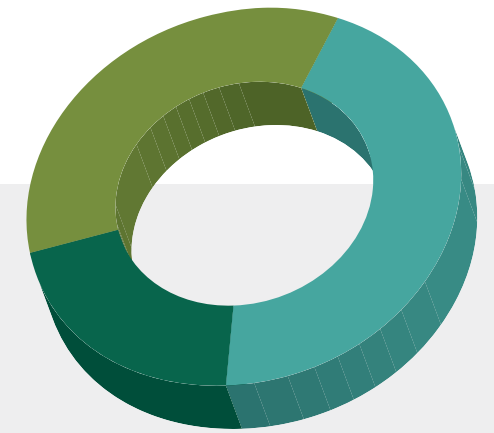
Forensic Interviewers made 87 referrals to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's Child Abuse, Referral and Evaluation (CARE) Clinic following the child's forensic interview at Mission Kids. Staffed by a team of physicians, social workers and mental health clinicians, the CARE Clinic provides specialized medical assessment and treatment for suspected child abuse victims.

65 Court Hearings

Family Advocates attended 65 court hearings and supported 261 children and family members at their court appearances following their forensic interview.

5,340 Phone Calls

Family Advocates made 5,340 follow-up calls to caregivers and Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) members to ensure the continuity of services to all families served at Mission Kids.

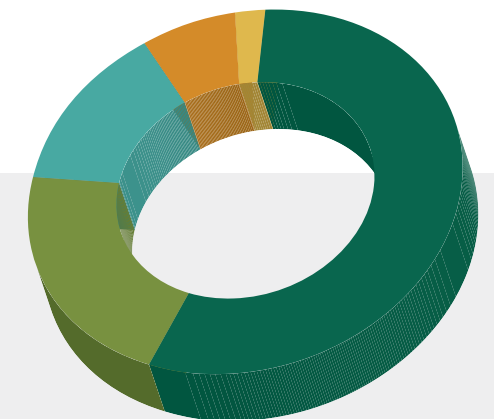

WHAT ARE CACs and how do they help kids?

To understand what a Child Advocacy Center (CAC) is, you must understand what children face without one. Without a CAC, the child may end up having to tell the worst story of his or her life over and over again to doctors, police, lawyers, investigators, judges, teachers, etc. What is worse is that they may not get the help they need to heal once the investigation is over.

Our Approach

Mission Kids provides a center for the team investigation of child abuse cases. Children are spared additional trauma through the investigative process once there is a suspicion of serious abuse. In Montgomery County, Mission Kids is referred all cases that involve allegations of serious physical child abuse, child sexual abuse and child witnesses to violent crime. In our child-friendly facility, Mission Kids works with our partners to provide the highest quality of interventions, which would allow for both protection and justice for the child. Through our strong partnerships with law enforcement, Montgomery County District Attorney's Office, Montgomery County Office of Children and Youth, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and mental health specialists, Mission Kids is here to help children and ensure a quick path to healing.

At its core, Mission Kids serves the children of Montgomery County who are, or have been, the victims of child abuse.

Mission Kids advocates for CACs on the state and national levels, in addition to working with international partners to find solutions to child abuse and the human trafficking of minors.

impact A MISSION KIDS HERO

Joy* was 12 when she came to Mission Kids to tell the story of her sexual abuse by a family member. Before the abuse had begun, Joy had been an outgoing, happy child, eager to learn and be a part of everything going on around her. However, by the time she came to Mission Kids, she had become unhappy, withdrawn, depressed and unmotivated.

Following her forensic interview, the multidisciplinary team investigating the abuse put a plan in place to ensure Joy would get the help she needed. An arrest was made, she was referred to counseling, and a Mission Kids Family Advocate worked with Joy's mother to connect her with much-needed community resources.

Fast forward 10 years. Joy just graduated from college with a degree in criminal justice after completing an internship with a prominent law firm in Blue Bell. Her goal is to help other kids just like her.

The forensic interview in 2010 changed Joy's life forever. Mission Kids was new at the time, and that interview happened **because of supporters like you!**

Thank you for making it possible for Joy to tell her story 10 years ago. Thank you for making it possible for the children who came into our Child Advocacy Center last week to tell theirs.

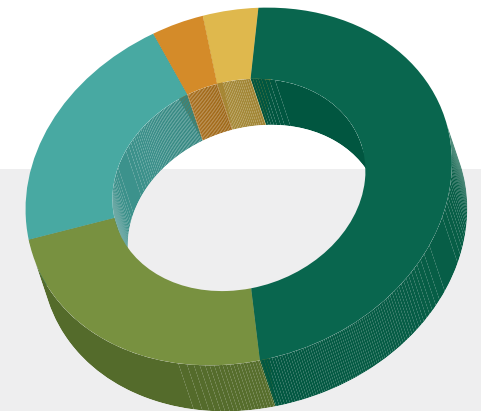

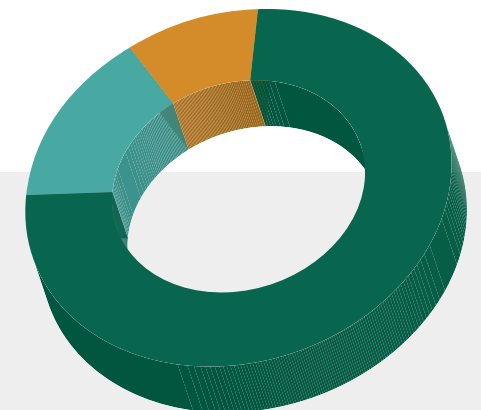

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

new in 2019

New Department

Mission Kids increased its outreach into the community with a primary focus on preventing child abuse by creating a new department, **Prevention Education and Outreach**. It is dedicated to creating and implementing an outreach strategy, with the goal to empower local communities to prevent, recognize and report instances of child abuse and ultimately reduce the number of children victimized in our community. Mission Kids is working to end this epidemic by giving children and adults the tools they need to identify and prevent child abuse.

Thanks to special funding from the **Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency**, Mission Kids began offering free Child Abuse Prevention Education programs for children ages 4-8. This fun, evidence-based, interactive and child-centered program is called **"ROAR"**. Surpassing the initial goal of training 1,000 children in the first 3 months of implementation, **Mission Kids conducted 119 Presentations for a total of 2,484 children ages 4-8 in 2019 in Montgomery County.**

With more than a decade of experience providing services to victims of child abuse, Mission Kids is working to end this epidemic by educating children and adults.

Psycho-Educational Support Group Formed

Mission Kids has partnered with **Children's Crisis Treatment Center** to provide its first-ever psycho-educational support group for caregivers of children who have been sexually abused. The group assists parents in developing an understanding related to trauma, how trauma impacts children of different age ranges and the impact of trauma on families. Caregivers were able to develop a clearer understanding of how trauma affects their child and learn tools to help them communicate with and support their child throughout the healing process.

Child Abuse & Trauma-informed Classrooms Collaborative Workshop



Creative
HEALTH SERVICES

Mission Kids partnered with **Creative Health Services** to provide 190 educators and school personnel from the Upper Merion School District and Methacton School District, along with education professionals at Pottstown Area Health and Wellness Foundation's "Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds" Institute, with a collaborative workshop that explored the effects of child abuse on children's behavior in the classroom and overall academic performance.



PA Sentencing Commission Visits Mission Kids

In May, Mission Kids welcomed representatives from the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing to tour our Child Advocacy Center and discuss trauma therapy services for children who witness domestic violence and the need for enhanced sentencing guidelines for offenders who commit violence in front of children. Board Member, District Attorney Kevin Steele, was instrumental in getting the Commission to visit Montgomery County. DA Steele also testified that someone guilty of domestic abuse in front of a child should be required to pay for therapy for that child. "Children who have been witnesses are much more likely to be victims or perpetrators later on," Steele said.

Human Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children

Human Trafficking (HT) and Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) is a scourge that all communities, including Montgomery County, unfortunately need to address. In 2019, Mission Kids identified 13 new cases of suspected victims of HT and assigned a Family Advocate to meet their needs. Working with our partners, CEO Abbie Newman and Hannah Cornell, Project Manager of the Sex Trafficking Response Team, completed the first year of a \$300,000, 2-year grant award by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to develop replicable policies and procedures for the entire state on creating a Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) response to HT and the CSEC.

Abbie also spoke as a Subject Matter Expert at a statewide training of MDTs in State College on HT and CSEC and was invited to work with the Child Welfare Resource Center (State Human Services) to create on-line training for new social workers statewide on CSEC. In addition, she taught classes at Penn State Abington on Child Sex Abuse and Mission Kids' work developing expertise as well as policy, protocols and training in responding to victims of human trafficking.

Family Advocates

Mission Kids Family Advocates educate, support, advocate and connect families with necessary services that help the child and the family heal after the trauma of child abuse.

In response to an increased need for these services, in 2019 Mission Kids:

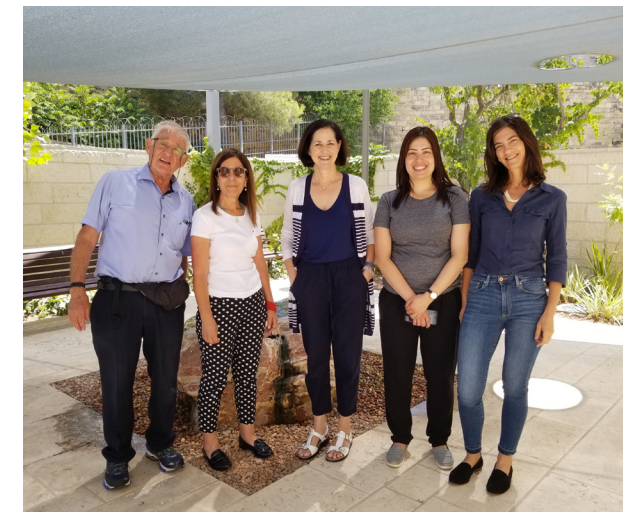
- Expanded its Family Advocate program by hiring an additional Family Advocate for a total of 4 full-time advocates and 1 supervisor
- Established an account with the rideshare company Lyft to provide transportation for families needing rides to and from Mission Kids, Montgomery County Courthouse during trials and CHOP medical appointments

CEO Abbie Newman

In the past 10 years, Mission Kids has become a state, national and international leader of Child Advocacy Centers. This year, in her role as CEO, Abbie Newman promoted Mission Kids' expertise and experience in responding to child abuse beyond our local community.

2019 saw Abbie:

- Elected to the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania State Chapter of Children's Advocacy Centers and Multidisciplinary Investigative Teams. This board's mission is to promote, assist and sustain Child Advocacy Centers and the multidisciplinary team approach for the protection of Pennsylvania's children from abuse on a statewide level
- Participate as an appointed member to Statewide Committees on the Child Advocacy Center Advisory Committee (CACAC) to help develop and sustain Child Advocacy Centers across Pennsylvania
- Participate on the Victim Services Advisory Committee (VSAC) to help fund services to all victims across the state
- Invited to speak at the 35th International Symposium on Child Abuse in Huntsville, AL, on "Tragedy to Triumph: How the Sandusky/Penn State Child Sexual Abuse Scandal Resulted in State Reforms"
- Visit the CAC in Jerusalem, Israel, and exchange ideas with Israeli colleagues including our international research partner, Dafna Tener, Ph.D., on the best ways to help victims of child abuse
- Achieve our first internationally-published original research article with Israeli researchers on MDT responses to sibling sexual abuse: "Child Advocacy Center intervention with sibling sexual abuse cases: Cross-cultural comparison of professionals' perspectives and experiences"
- Work virtually with a non-profit in Uganda to support the development of a community response to child abuse in Uganda
